## ABOUT YOUNG AUSTRALIANS IN INTERNATIONAL AFFAIRS

Young Australians in International Affairs (YAIA) is a not-for-profit organisation dedicated to connecting and engaging the next generation of Australian leaders in international affairs and to building the high calibre leaders necessary to navigate Australia's future in the Indo-Pacific century. YAIA is a company limited by guarantee and a registered charity with the Australian Charities and Not-for-profit Commission (ACNC).

## ABOUT THE ROLE

The Future Leaders Series (FLS) Director is responsible for overseeing the organisation, planning and delivery of the YAIA Future Leaders Series, to be held online in **July/August 2025**. The successful applicant will lead and work with a team of volunteers to organise and deliver the Future Leaders Series. These include the Chief Executive Officer, Chief Events Officer and Events Officers. The Future Leaders Series Director is a key member of the Extended Leadership Team and will work closely alongside other National Directors. This year's theme is Conflict Resolution and Risk Reduction.

The Future Leaders Series is our annual flagship program designed to engage Australia's future leaders in the critical issues affecting Australia, the Indo-Pacific region and the international system. Each year, the Future Leaders Series adopts a central theme based on one such critical issue. It equips them with the knowledge, skills and networks to respond to these challenges and shape future policy decisions.

The Future Leaders Series takes place over a six-week period in **July/August**. During this time, participants will take part in 5 modules, each focusing on a particular issue or challenge within the **broader theme of the year's program, which is Conflict Prevention and Resolution**, as well as a policy workshop and a policy pitch competition. During these sessions, participants explore the different issues, opportunities and challenges associated with the topic; as well as how it is being considered by Australian policy makers.
